Opportunities to Respond

One of the best ways for teachers to know if students understand the material is to ask them! When teachers give all students opportunities to respond (OTR's) to academic prompts, their students' learning quickly becomes visible. Teachers are then able to adjust their teaching to meet the needs of all the learners in their class.

At Pershing, we use a variety of methods to make student learning visible including written responses, non-verbal responses, and verbal responses. Research shows that using a variety of opportunities to respond results in an increase of ontask behavior and academic engagement.

Boys Town Social Skills: Below are the following social skills we have been teaching, practicing, and reinforcing. These are great skills you can teach, practice, and reinforce at home as well

Having a Conversation

- 1. Look at the person.
- 2. Use a pleasant voice
- 3. Listen to what the other person says
- 4. When there is a break in the conversation, ask a question or share your thoughts.

Working with Others

- 1. Identify the task to be completed
- 2. Assign tasks to each person
- 3. Discuss ideas in a calm, quiet voice and let everybody share their ideas
- 4. Work on task until complete

OUTDOOR RECESS:

We recognize the need for students to play outside and therefore, every attempt will be make to use the playground when possible. There is not a district-wide temperature that requires schools to have indoor recess. Every playground has unique characteristics and locations that may protect or expose students to the elements. At the building we will make the determination of indoor/outdoor recess based on the temperature, wind chill, precipitation, progress of snow and ice removal of the grounds.

Students are encouraged to dress appropriately for the weather. During wet, snowy weather, students not adequately dressed for the conditions will be asked to remain on the concrete play area for recess.

If students are not well enough to play outside, they are usually not well enough to be in school. Unless a physician's excuse has been obtained, a note from the parent/guardian is required each day that a students is to remain indoors during recess. The note should state the reason for the request.



TREATS & INVITATIONS:

Classrooms recognize birthdays in a variety of ways. Students are not allowed to bring birthday treats (edible or nonedible). Please do not send gifts, party favors, balloons, or flowers. These items will not be delivered to classrooms.

Invitations will not be distributed during the school day. Teachers should be notified ahead of time if a student has invitations to distribute after school. Phone numbers and addresses cannot be distributed by an school personnel.



Safety Reminder

We are working really hard to teach students how to be safe when they come to school and leave school. Please help us by reminding your children to use the crosswalks at all times. Crosswalks signal drivers that adults and children may be crossing, so they are more aware in these areas. With cars coming up and down Judson and the pull up lane, it is important

students have distance between themselves and the moving traffic. Thank you for your participation in keeping all students safe!

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
