

Reading at Home:

Below are some tips and ways to incorporate reading at home. It is important for students to be able to practice their pre-reading and reading skills at home. There are many quick and easy ways to include this practice as part of your routine at home.



IMPORTANT! Arrival Drop off & Dismissal Pick-Up

- For morning drop off please see Pershing's arrival traffic plan located in the Student/Parent Handbook. It is important that you become familiar with this traffic pattern to ensure the safety of all our Pershing students. The south side of Judson Street is not a safe spot to drop students off. This side of the street is a No Parking Zone, please do not drop students off on the south side. Follow the recommended traffic and use the cut-out to temporarily park to drop students off, or the north side of Judson (along the school side) to drop students off.
- At Dismissal, students will only cross at the crosswalks at 64th & 63rd and Judson. There are certified staff members placed at these locations and will be able to help students safely cross the street. Please do not wave your student across the street. There is no parking signs along the south side of Judson. When you park across the street, it impacts the flow of traffic going east and west down Judson. Thank you for your flexibility and understanding in making sure that our students arrive and get home safely each day.

Pets on Property:

Lincoln Public Schools require animals to be certified to be on property at school.

There are few circumstances where animals are tied to a curricular area and may gain permission from the building to be on property. All family pets must remain off property during student hours which includes family events, arrival, and dismissal times. This helps us reach our number one goal of keeping students safe.

Volunteering at Pershing:

You can make a difference in the life of a student by serving in variety of volunteering opportunities: reading to a child, shelving books in the library, and much more. Each and every volunteer helps our students learn, grow and succeed. We are grateful to you for sharing valuable time with Pershing and LPS.

We have established several volunteer "levels", based on contact with students and supervision by LPS staff. Please see below to determine which level applies to your volunteer interest.

Level 1: If you are interest in a Level 1 volunteer activity, simply contact Pershing. You are not required to fill out a volunteer form. (Examples may include but are not limited to: helping with a school mailing or helping in the media center shelving books.)

Level 2 or 3: If you are interested in a Level 2 or 3 volunteer activities, please fill out the volunteer form located on our volunteer webpage. Make sure you fill out all the application fields completely and accurately. The link is also located on the front of the LPS website (www.lps.org), under Popular Pages.

You will be asked to provide basic information, as well as sign a Volunteer Code of Conduct and a Personal Disclosure. This information is necessary in our continuing effort to provide safety and security to our students and staff.

Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) at Pershing:

Multi-tiered System of Supports for Behavior (MTSS-B) is a research-based framework for teaching and supporting positive behaviors for ALL students. This school-wide approach to discipline focuses on building a safe and positive environment in which all students can learn. The benefits of implementing MTSS-B include:

- fewer behavior issues
- more instructional time
- increased attendance for student success.

The foundation of MTSS-B in Lincoln Public Schools lies in the fundamental expectations developed by each of our schools. At Pershing school, our expectations are Be Safe, Be Respectful & Be Responsible.

Boys Town Social Skills: Below are the following social skills we have been teaching, practicing and reinforcing. These are great skills you can teach, practice and reinforce at home as well.

Following Instructions

- 1. Look at the person
- 2. Say "okay" or nod your head
- Do what was asked, right away

Greeting Others

- 1. Look at the Person
- 2. Use a pleasant voice
- 3. Say "Hi" or "Hello"

Accepting 'No' for an Answer

- 1. Look at the person
- 2. Say "okay" or not your head
- 3. Stay calm
- 4. If you disagree, ask later

ENTRY FEES:

\$12 Per Runner: June 1 - September 20 \$15 Per Runner: September 21 - October 4

ENTRY DEADLINES:

Runners registering through their school must have their completed entry form to their P.E. teacher by **Friday**, **September 20**. Registrations WILL NOT be accepted through the schools after September 20. **On-site entries WILL be accepted.**

NOTE: Runners are encouraged to run without an adult/sibling. However, an adult/sibling is allowed to run with their child free of charge.
