
Arrival Drop off & Dismissal Pick-Up

*Students may arrive at 7:45 a.m. for breakfast

*Students not eating breakfast should arrive at 8:00 a.m. **Students should not arrive prior** to 7:45 as there is no supervision before then.

ARRIVAL & Dismissal DROP OFF & PICK UP:

- To ensure a smooth and safe drop off for all students, please make sure you are following our traffic plan as pictured to the right. If you prefer to walk your child to school, wait to watch them walk in the building, or anything that requires stopping time, please find designated parking around the building and walk with your child to school or pull into the cut-out and park your car there. Please do not stop and park your car in the drop off lane that runs west on Judson.
- We are trying to decrease as much congestion as possible at arrival and dismissal, following the traffic plan will make drop off and pick up efficient and safe so that we do not back traffic up along Judson. It's time to register your kindergarten student

Do you have a child that will start kindergarten next year? Lincoln Public Schools is now accepting kindergarten registrations for the 2020-2021 school year. The first deadline for families to register their child to guarantee they receive important school information is March 31, 2020.

Parents of children turning five years of age before July 31, 2020 can go to Ips.org and click on the red "Enroll Your Student" button. Here you will also find all the information necessary for registering, the required documents needed and answers to frequently asked questions.

For children who turn five between August 1 and October 15, parents may request an assessment for their child to receive a waiver to attend school early. That information is also located on the kindergarten registration page.

Access Amazing Library Resources from Home!

Did you know many of our fabulous library resources can be accessed from home? If your student is looking for educational games to play or fun activities to do online, we encourage them to check out the library resources at home! The library provides access to fun educational sites for students for free. To do this, go to your school library website and click on "Home Access" to get the login information. Many of the library's resources can also be accessed by logging into the portal from home. Go to portal.lps.org and type in your student's LPS ID number and password to see what is available for your student to access from home!

Digital Citizenship Tips

LPS teachers instruct students about digital law when they help students explore how terms of service agreements and privacy policies are important and have real-world implications. Topics for a family discussion might include:

- What are terms of service agreements? (Rules you must follow when using an app or digital tool.)
- Why should you be aware of terms of service agreements? What are the consequences of using apps not intended for students your age? (Many terms of service agreements include age requirements for the app or digital tool. If you use a tool that you are not old enough to use, your account may be canceled, your safety may be compromised, and you may see inappropriate content.)

LPS has procedures in place to ensure the apps and websites students are using adhere to the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act.

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Safety Reminder

We are working really hard to teach students how to be safe when they come to school and leave school. Please help us by reminding your children to use the crosswalks at all times. Crosswalks signal drivers that adults and children may be crossing, so they are more aware in these areas. With cars coming up and down Judson and the pull up lane, it is important

students have distance between themselves and the moving traffic. T keeping all students safe!
